REFLECTION

When people come into the Catholic faith, they ultimately had to give up something. Maybe they gave up a disbelief in God, or gave up an ignorance of Christ. Maybe they gave up a sinful behaviour and took on a spiritual devotion. Making a decision to go in one direction naturally means making a decision not to go in any number of other directions. When we choose to come to church to worship God and receive Jesus through the Scriptures and in the Eucharist, we are choosing not to ignore Jesus. In that sense, we are choosing to remain on the branch of Christ, remain connected to him so we can grow and be nurtured from him. The first reading from Acts concludes with an encouraging statement: "the church throughout all Judea, Galilee and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers." We did indeed see our church and our parishes grow in numbers at the Easter Vigil as people were baptised and confirmed into the faith. Through these sacraments, especially through the Eucharist those people connected themselves to the vine of Christ. The initial connection to the branch, although a critically important step, is far from the last step. Each and every day we must remain on the branch, remain on the vine, because Jesus says, "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." Jesus never departed from God the Father who is the vine grower, and thus we should never depart from Jesus the vine.

The question of how to remain steadfastly connected to the vine of Christ is one that often occupies the hearts and minds of believers. John offers a clear answer in the 2nd reading, emphasising the importance of obedience to God's commandments as the key to abiding in Christ. Conscientiously adhering to the teachings and example set forth by Jesus, partaking in the spiritual nourishment of the Eucharist, we solidify our connection to the vine.

Granted, we're a long way from next year's Easter Vigil, but that thought shouldn't stop us for praying for those becoming connected to Christ and his church next year. Just think of the countless number of baptisms that will also happen between then and now, each one a new leaf on the vine of Christ. And Although we may not yet know their names, we may not yet know their stories, God already does and the Holy Spirit is at work, nourishing us, keeping us connected to Christ.

LITURGY OF THE WORD WITH **HOLY COMMUNION**

The Liturgical Centre of the Catholic Diocese of Auckland offered training & formation for Lay Leaders of Liturgical Prayer, who would lead people in worship through the Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion. The training took place over five Saturdays last year from March to July. Saint Mary's Parish Northcote were fortunate to have generous lay leaders participate in this program. They were commissioned during the 10:30am Mass last Easter Sunday. Starting on Monday, 6 May 2024 and Mondays henceforth, these Lay Leaders of Liturgical Prayer would be leading a Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion at 9:15am in lieu of Mass. This will further enhance the liturgical life of our parish community, expanding and respecting the baptismal priesthood of each one of us. WHAT IS THE SOCIETY OF ST.VINCENT DE PAUL?

It is an international organization, founded in Paris in 1833 by Frederic Ozanam and his fellow students, to address the poverty they saw around them. It has now spread throughout the world.

The first Society in New Zealand was formed in Christchurch in July 1867 and reached St Mary's Northcote in September 1965.

We are not affiliated to De Paul House. Although we share the same dedication to the poor as they do, we are not a part of their organization. They concentrate on housing those in society who are homeless. Our mission is to care for those who are needy in the Northcote area. We visit those who are lonely or unwell and have a chat. We help those struggling financially to fed their families, by delivering food parcels to them. We help families with expenses for school uniforms & stationery We transport people to appointments, shopping or to Mass. Some of our Members help with serving food after Funerals and other parish gatherings. Every week we pick up bread from a local baker and distribute it to the needy families, local schools, for their 'school breakfast programme' to people living in motels and motor camps and to De Paul House for them to distribute to their Residents and others in need.

We rely on you our parishioners for the finances to keep our work going in the area and we are very grateful to those of you who donate to our cause. You can contribute to our monthly collection at the entrance of the church on the 1st Sunday of the month, or online to our bank Account: Account no, 12-3035-0505571-00.
