09th MARCH 2025 FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

REFLECTION

In the wilderness, Satan tempts Jesus, like the Hebrews tempted God in the desert, to turn stones into bread so that he might eat. Jesus responds by quoting Deuteronomy 8: 3, "One does not live by bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God". In other words, Jesus is reminding Satan, as well as you and me today, that life is much more than the here and now. We can, at times, get caught up in the business and pettiness of our daily lives, And we run the risk of prioritising those things which are really not so important when all is said and done. I think of some people who waste so much time obsessing over acquiring the best designer handbags and binge watching TV shows just so they can keep up with the culture and attempt to outdo their peers.

There is certainly, in each and everyone of us, at one time or another, the desire for glory, power and recognition in the world. There is that part of us that is so caught up in current events, politics, and the routines of everyday life that we can lose sight of that one thing, or rather, of that one person who is most important. Remember what Jesus says to the busy and preoccupied Martha, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things.

There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her" (Lk. 10:41).

Brothers and sisters, may this Lent be for us a reminder to look beyond the here and now and focus on that which is eternal and beneficial to our souls. We are not just material beings - we are spiritual beings who need nourishment from the Word of God that we hear in scripture, and who need the ultimate nourishment. The Eucharist, the Word of God made flesh. Without this we become empty; we wind up like those objects which, though one time beautiful, are, in the end, strewn about, useless, with no life in them. And so we are reminded to focus, especially during the Lenten season, on spiritual things, to prioritise those things in our life that are really most important, those things which will bring us closer to love for God and neighbour, and to nourish our souls with spiritual races that will bring us to everlasting life. Jesus Himself reminds us of this "Heaven and earth will pass away, but MY words will not pass away" (Mt.24:35). And so this Lent, when we find ourselves tempted by Satan in the desert to seek comfort and pleasure or attachment to passing things, let us respond with the words of Christ "One does not live by

PROLIFE FACTS

A 'safe area' is a 300m bubble around an abortion facility, within which it is illegal to express any pro-life views or speech on the issue of abortion. Even offering help and support to pregnant women is banned inside these zones. It's hard to understate the implications of this degree of authoritarianism - in effect, there are now places in New Zealand where even a civil conversation about the issue of abortion, or charitably offering a woman caring alternatives to abortion, could result in a criminal charge. Regardless of authoritarian laws, however, the pro-life movement is continuing to speak out against the grave injustice of abortion, and working hard towards caring solutions.
